### Police, Westmorland and Furness Council, and Public Participation

### 22/2025 Police

The Clerk had looked on the Police.uk website on 17/2/2025:- December 2024 - 1 Criminal damage or arson – on or near the Square -investigation complete no suspect identified; 1 other theft – on or near the Square – under investigation; 1 vehicle crime – crime on or near Red Lion Yard – under investigation.

### 23/2025 Westmorland and Furness Council and National Trust

Westmorland and Furness Councillor – had sent a report outlining what she has been working on as follows: Coniston Medical Centre closure meeting further update after; Coniston bathing water meeting, UU have started working on asset improvement; Road closure at Clappersgate and 4 way control causing many issues, have written to CEO and Cabinet, ENW have been there 4 months now; Formal consultation on 20mph has started last phase of process; Devolution Cumbria in next phase will mean Mayoral election, should mean more influence on transport and infrastructure but not clear yet; Ferry has been off again, very frustrated about performance; Other update now the Chair of South Lake Locality Board.

National Trust – a newsletter update had been received a copy available on the PC website next to these Minutes.

### 24/2025 Public Participation

A member of the public wanted to voice concern that the Old Police Car Park is full in the evenings and they cannot get parked – some vehicles without permit stickers – Councillors confirmed that there are over 100 permit holders and less spaces than this, which has always been the situation. The wardens do not attend in the evening but Cllrs if in the area will have a look and see if the vehicles without permits can be identified.

A member of the public wanted to report that the gullies appear to be blocked at Hawksgarth and the wall is starting to lean over on the field side onto the road, the wall on both sides from Keen Ground towards the Coniston turn are starting to move too. Clerk to report to Highways.

A member of the public wanted to ask if there were any developments of the grass cutting on Hawksgarth as a couple of residents are keen to do it. Councillors confirmed that the grass cutting in Hawksgarth is not the responsibility of the Parish Council and that the Westmorland and Furness Council agree and pay the contractors who do this job. It was agreed that the member of public would speak to Cllr Pender regarding this.

A member of the public wanted to discuss the Ferry – concerned about all the errors which have occurred recently and in the last year with maintenance and engine issues. Concerned about the future of the ferry as

7/2024/5684 - Lama Lodge, Hawkshead, Ambleside LA22 0QB – Replacement of substandard wooden dwellinghouse with contemporary self-build dwellinghouse with associated works including new highway access – discussion took place and all Cllrs agreed that they strongly object on the following grounds: - There has already been an illegal felling of a considerable amount of trees to make this space available on the site.Safety concerns regarding proposed entrance is on a section of road with low visibility, narrow with bends There were concerns previously about the current building being a holiday home without permission. The proposed new build is considerably bigger than the current building (this will impact on local utilities, local neighbourhood outlook) The visual impact is not in keeping with dwellings which surround it. No mention of local occupancy. There is no demand for any addition holiday homes in the area. There is a desperate need for local affordable housing. Clerk to notify Planning
